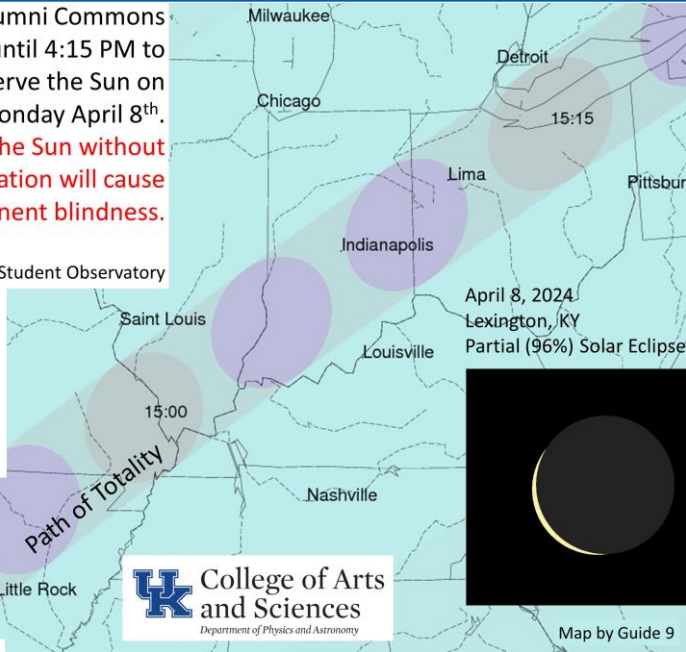


Kentucky SkyTalk

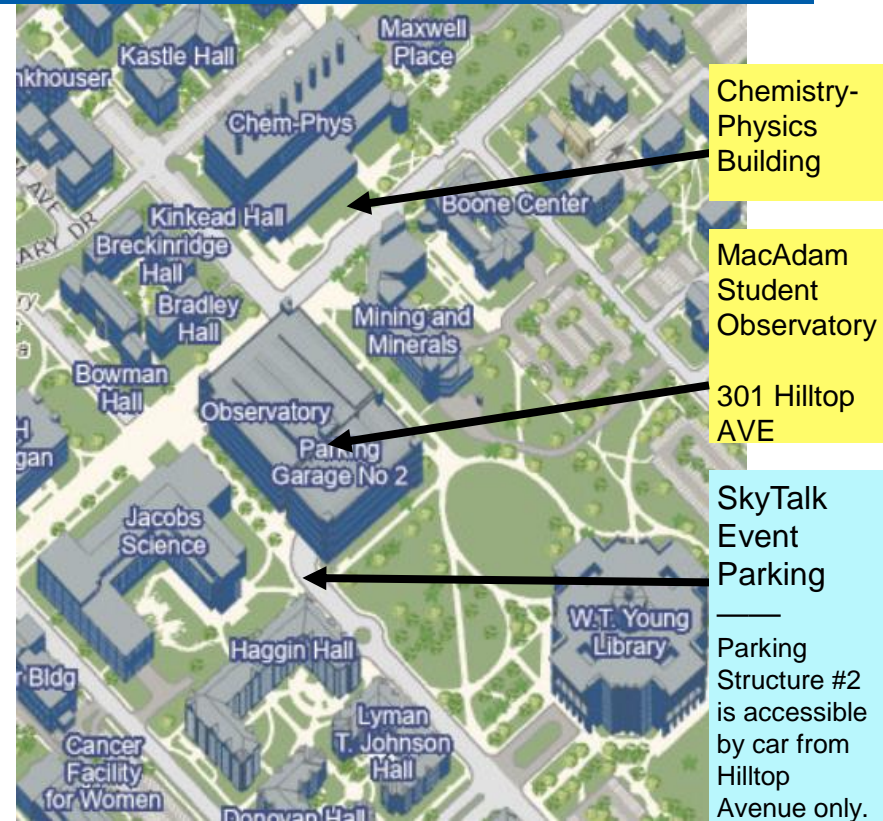
Total Eclipse of the Sun 2024

Where, When, and How

The total eclipse of the Sun on April 8, 2024 presents a rare opportunity to witness the most spectacular predictable event in nature. Day will turn into semi-darkness; wildlife will be confused; and human beings will be mesmerized. By far, the best spectacle is in the "path of totality", a narrow path crossing the U.S. from Texas to Maine. Lexington is outside the path of totality, but the light of day will dim here as well. Learn what to expect in Lexington and in the path of totality (e.g. Bloomington IN). And learn how to view the eclipse while keeping your eyes safe.
